



How to Use the Fireplace



PLEASE NOTE: GUESTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SAFE OPERATION OF THE FIREPLACE, ANY MISUSE RESULTING IN DAMAGE, INJURY, OR VIOLATION OF LOCAL ORDINANCES WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF DEPOSIT AND POTENTIAL FINES/FELONY CHARGES.

Before You Light a Fire:

1. Make sure there is nothing combustible (clothes, furniture, books, magazine, phones/tablets) on or near the fireplace.
2. Use only the provided kindling and firewood next to the fireplace. **DO NOT BURN ANYTHING ELSE IN THE FIREPLACE.**
3. **NEVER USE LIGHTER FLUID, GASOLINE, OR ACCELERANTS.** Only matches or a lighter should be used to ignite a fire.
4. Make sure the handle (Catalytic) on the side of the fireplace is **POINTED DOWN** and the handle on the bottom (Flue) is pulled out towards you.





You're Ready to Build a Fire

1. Open fireplace door and add kindling wood.
2. Light the kindling wood with match or lighter.
3. Add firewood as needed.
4. Watch the temperature gauge on the side of the fireplace. If the gauge reads **"Too Hot"**, then push the handle (Flue) on the bottom of the fireplace inwards. This will cut off the air and cause the fire to down.
5. **NEVER LEAVE THE HOUSE WITH THE FIREPLACE UNATTENDED.**



When You're Done with the Fireplace

1. **DO NOT USE WATER TO EXTINGUISH THE FIRE.** Push the handle on the bottom of the fireplace (Flue) all the way inwards. This will cut off the airflow, and the fire will go out by itself.
2. When the fire is completely out and the temperature gauge is in the "Creosote" range (dial is near 100 mark), use the provided broom and shovel to clean out the ash. Place the ash in the ash can. **NEVER DUMP HOT ASH IN THE GARBAGE OR ANYWHERE ON THE PROPERTY.**
3. Turn the handle (Catalytic) on the side of the fireplace so it is facing upwards.
